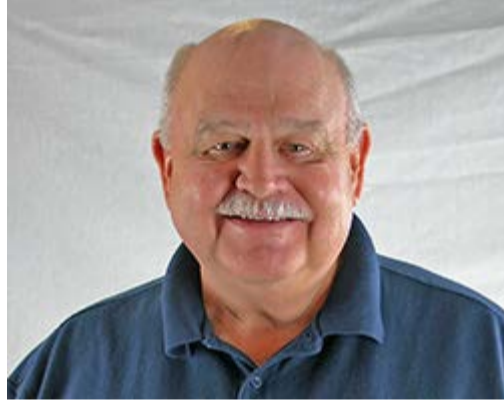


AMA's Response to the U.S. DOT announcement

The DOT is looking at the full spectrum of sUAS that would be subject to registration, and AMA agrees that registration may be appropriate at some level; however, before the process can be established, AMA believes that a threshold must be identified that will determine which platforms, what aircraft with what capabilities, will require registration and which will not. AMA does not and will not support any proposal that calls for the registration of any sUAS that fall below an established threshold and is resolute in its position that all forms of traditional model aircraft must remain exempt from the registration process.

AMA's Rich Hanson awarded Paul Tissandier Diploma from FAI

AMA's Government and Regulatory Affairs Director, Rich Hanson was recently awarded Paul Tissandier Diploma from Fédération Aéronautique Internationale (FAI). The Paul Tissandier Diploma was established by the FAI in 1952 and is awarded to those who have served the cause of Aviation and Sporting Aviation, by their work, initiative, and devotion or in other ways. Rich was named for his significant impact on model aviation through his efforts to ensure that model aviation integrates with the National Airspace System (NAS). His work to protect model aviation and AMA members from over regulation by the FAA is considered to be one of the most significant achievements in AMA's history.

California governor vetoes bills regulating hobbyist drone flight

Recently, California Governor Jerry Brown vetoed a number of bills that would have increased penalties for flying drones over wildfires, grade schools, and prisons in the state. One of the most notable drone bills that got vetoed would have increased the penalties for flying drones over wildfires in California. In his veto message, Gov. Brown explained his reasoning for vetoing the bills: Each of these bills creates a new crime-usually by finding a novel way to characterize and criminalize conduct that is already proscribed. This multiplication and particularization of criminal behavior creates increasing complexity without commensurate benefit.
